When I offered up "small wonders" as the theme for this year's THF volunteers' anthology, little did I quite anticipate the anything-but-small response which would result: a veritable trove of haiku treasures from a record number (122) of participants.

As one might expect from such a theme, many of these poems are rich in detail. On the pages that follow, you will encounter the eyes both of violets and dingoes; evidence of inky-black mushrooms and ghostly white chemo hairs; the languor of a leaf-riding beetle and the jaunty step of a fireman's dog; plus much, much more.

This attention to detail is, of course, a hallmark of haiku as well as a natural byproduct of the haiku poet's innate or acquired attentiveness, celebrated in this volume's title with an excerpt from Kristen Lindquist's delightful poem within (and with apologies to Ram Dass): bee here now

Here too you'll enter a garden of sensory delights: the scents of eucalyptus, sassafras and Darjeeling; the buzz of neon, the "flop, flap and whirr / of dustbathing sparrows," the clinking of ice cream scoops, plus a little "ding" from the dishwasher; not to mention "the slow burn / of a single malt"—just to name a few.

And what emotional bandwidth this collection represents. Here you'll experience moments of surprise, tenderness, humor, contemplation, and sheer beauty.

These are the works of many of The Haiku Foundation's widely dispersed, deeply engaged and highly-talented volunteers, so I suppose that the variety and richness of the haiku on display here should not have surprised me after all. Busy "bees" all, they keep our haiku hive buzzing and vital — here now, and for the years ahead.






